

Homework

Redbridge aims for Year 7 pupils to become independent learners. One of the ways that this is encouraged is through the completion of homework. Each homework task that they complete will help to consolidate and extend knowledge learnt during lessons, instill good habits of independent learning and prepare students for exam success.

Year 7 pupils should expect to receive homework on a two weekly basis (once during their two week timetable) in all their EBac subjects, which includes English, Maths, Science, Languages and Humanities. It is recommended that year 7 pupils spend approximately 30 minutes per night doing this. Homework will be set using the online platform 'Google classroom'. This software is used by all teachers to enable pupils to see details of the tasks set and the date that it should be completed by.

Students

Expectations

- Students are expected to work hard and make good or outstanding effort with the homework tasks they submit (score 1-2).
- Students are expected to actively use 'Google classroom' to organise their time and produce homework in line with deadlines set by class teachers.

Marking

- Pupils should be aware of what the scoring 1-4 represents and that scoring 3 or 4 is unacceptable.

Rewards/incentives

- Students should be aware that they can get positive Erefs for homework (for scoring 1)
- Students will have the opportunity to receive rewards in celebration assemblies for consistently completing homework on time and of a good standard (1-2 scores).

Sanctions

- Students should be aware that they can get negative Erefs for homework (for scoring 4)
- Students will be requested to attend afterschool sessions in order to improve their efforts with the completion of homework and letters will be sent home if they consistently score 3-4 on their homework tasks.
