This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

At Redbridge we are fully inclusive and our lessons are accessible by all students. We work closely with the SEND department in order to achieve this. Students receive one hour per fortnight of Music in Years 7 and 8 which is supported by an hour per fortnight of Music Performance in Year 9. Students who have opted for Music at KS4 receive a further 4 hours per fortnight of tuition. Year 10 has 6 hours per fortnight and Year 11 has 5 hours. The KS3 curriculum has been constructed using the National Curriculum guidance, aspects of the Model Music Curriculum and content from the National Plan for Music Education. All lessons offer opportunities for practical music making. Alongside this, we offer FREE instrumental/vocal tuition to many students. We work in

partnership with South Coast Music Partnership. We also work with local musicians and artists in partnership

In KS4 students work towards the Level ½ Vocational Award in Performing Arts, following the Music pathway. All students receive free instrumental/vocal tuition in the instrument of their choice. There are opportunities to work towards graded examinations.

Part B: Co-curricular music

Free instrumental tuition is available in brass, rap, violin, keyboard, piano, bass, guitar, woodwind, drums and singing. These lessons occur during the school day and are delivered by expert peripatetic teachers or music staff.

The Music department offers a free, varied extra-curricular offer to all. This includes Garageband club, Jazz Band, Singing Group, Upper School Band and Lower School Band. The Music room is open for practise during most breaks and lunchtimes to further support progress. The school also stages a bi-annual school production.

Part C: Musical experiences

Termly performances are scheduled for Christmas, Easter and Summer. Parents and the community are invited to attend these. A fortnightly 'Live Lounge' performance occurs in the school canteen which features students from all year groups performing to their peers. In 2024 we hosted the Hip Hop workshop for the Southampton Music Hub. In 2024-5 we are hoping to take part in an opera project, a visit to the Royal Albert Hall and opportunities to watch live performances at the theatre. Where offered, we take opportunities to work with professional artists. School performances are free. For visits we ask for a contribution to cover the ticket costs and travel. However, we can use the pupil premium fund if required to subsidise the costs. We provide opportunities for our Shine students to extend their musical experience through workshops and visits where possible. They are also encouraged to have instrumental tuition with expert peripatetic teachers.

In the future
